

- Observe:** What strikes you/jumps out in the text?
- Observe:** Circle “God” each time it appears in this passage. List all the things God did. Why does Peter emphasize these things?
- Observe:** How is faith in Jesus described in this passage?
- Note:** this question will get blank stares... that’s ok! The goal is to lead the group through the reality that faith in Jesus is both a mind thing (it’s rational, Peter’s sermon points to historical fact after historical fact, especially to the resurrection) as well as a heart thing (v.37)
- Observe:** Discuss the response (and affect) the Gospel demands from people (v.38-41). Go through these slowly. Define each one. Paint a picture of how this could/should in everyday life.
- Observe:** What does the gospel message offer in response to repentance/faith (v.21,39,...)?
- Interperet:** What does it mean for Jesus to be “LORD” (v.36)? Press in, this is very rich!
- Interperet:** How have you seen folks “cut to the heart” by the message of Jesus (v.37)?
- Application:** How have you been cut to the heart by the message of Jesus?
Has it happened lately? If not, why?
- Application:** On a practical everyday basis, how is Jesus LORD of your life (v.36)?

Prayer Time and Homework: 1) Does anyone need to repent and/or be baptized? 2) How well can you recognize what God is doing in the present based on your familiarity with what he has done in the past? How much time and toil are you willing to put into it?

Let's summarize the main points of Peter's street preachin':

- 2.14-21 The events of Pentecost were the fulfillment of God's promise to give the Spirit.
Read Joel 2.28-32, John 14.26, 15.26-27, and 16.12-16.
- 2.22-24 Jesus is who he said he was (the Messiah, the Son of God). The crucifixion and resurrection were all part of God's plan. Read Luke 9.18-22.
- 2.25-36 Jesus is Lord. All authority has been given to Him. Therefore, he gives the Spirit of God to all who place their trust in Him.
Read Psalm 16, Psalm 110.1, 2 Sam. 17.11b-16, Matt. 1.1, and Matt. 22.41-46.
- 2.37-41 "Repent and be baptized..."
Read Mark 1.4,14-15, Luke 13.3, Luke 24.46-48, and Matt. 28.18-19.

Acts 2.14 Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. 15 These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! 16 No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. 18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. 19 I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. 20 The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. 21 And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Acts 2.22 "Men of Israel, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. 23 This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. 24 But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. 25 David said about him: "'I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. 26 Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will live in hope, 27 because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. 28 You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.'"

Acts 2.29 "Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. 30 But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. 31 Seeing what was ahead, he spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to the grave, nor did his body see decay. 32 God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact. 33 Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. 34 For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said, "'The Lord said to my Lord: 'Sit at my right hand 35 until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet.'"

Acts 2.36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ."

Acts 2.37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

Acts 2.38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off — for all whom the Lord our God will call."

Acts 2.40 With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." 41 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.
