WEEK 1 • MEMORY VERSE • ROMANS 1:17

For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

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ROMANS (CHAPTERS 5-8)

TUESDAY (10/13/20)

Read Romans 5:1-5

- ② Chapter 5 starts with "therefore." So we have to ask ourselves, "what is the 'therefore' *there for*?" In light of the previous chapters, that we all stand guilty before God, what is he saying in these first verses?
- Define the word justified:

When you think of a situation of suffering in your life right now (or someone that you are close to), which of the products of suffering well give you the most encouragement?

Where do you need hope in the midst of a challenging situation or place of suffering?

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MONDAY (10/26/20)

We saw in Romans 5 that God was creating a *new humanity* in Jesus. Romans 6 explained that we are "alive in Christ." Now in Romans 7, Paul answers the questions, "What the Law was for? What purpose did it serve? If God was going to redeem people to Himself through Jesus' death and resurrection, why all the hoopla with the Law?"

★ Read Romans 7:1-6

Why do you think Paul uses a marriage illustration?

When you think back to before being "joined to Christ"- what is some of the "fruit of death" that you remember growing?

What fruit in your life now is evidence of your being a part of God's family? How do you see yourself growing?

☐ Sit and spend some time quietly, praying, and asking the Holy Spirit to show you how He has been at work in you, and also where He wants to work going forward.



TUESDAY (10/27/20)

T Read Romans 7:7-25

Write a one sentence summary for the tension Paul is expressing in this section:

The Law showed us what was sin (v. 7). Ideally, the Law should lead us to life as we obey the good commands set before us. Easy, right? Not exactly! Paul says that sin "seized the opportunity" in verse 8. How does this work in your own words? What opportunity did sin seize?

② Elsewhere, Peter explains that satan is like a roaring lion - prowling about wanting to devour and destroy us. This is a sobering picture to think of sin, through satan, seeking to ensnare me and destroy me. How have you seen this at work in your life? Where does sin take opportunity with you?

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WEDNESDAY (10/28/20)

These are hard words in this chapter. Remember to pause and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and show you truth!

- Reread Romans 7:7-25
- What is some of the "good" that you would like to see yourself doing right now, but aren't doing it?
- ② Describe some of the war inside of you right now? In what areas of your life is the good & the evil going "toe to toe?"
- ? How does this war tend to make you feel?
- **?** From what we've learned in Romans thus far, how would you answer Paul's gut wrenching question in verse 24?

- We are going to do something a little different today. Open your Bible app, or download a Bible app, on your phone.
- Listen to Romans chapters 1-8 all the way through. This was a letter written to a specific church, but was read as a letter.

I think it helps grasp the overall scope if we listen to some larger chunks. Similar to the chunks we have been reading at Nehemiah Nights in Revelation!

Ø Write out things that popped out to you as you read:

- Spend some time praying and reflecting this morning around the idea of being not condemned.
- Journal or write our areas where you have felt condemned in the past, perhaps areas where others have actually condemned you. Speak aloud to each area the truth that we are no longer condemned. We are welcomed and loved into an incredible family.

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MONDAY (11/2/20)

- **★** Read Romans 8:5-8
- How does someone move from living according to the sinful nature to living according to the Spirit?

② How do we know what the Spirit desires? How can this be possible?

What does Paul mean that "mind governed by the flesh is death (v. 6)?"

When your mind is controlled by the Spirit, how have you seen life and peace there?

TUESDAY (11/3/20)

1 Read Romans 8:9-11

Explain verse 9b "if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ":

Who is the "you" at the beginning of verses 9. Does this apply to the whole world? Just the church in Rome? Who is controlled by the Spirit?

② Are you someone whom the Spirit of Christ is living in and is controlled by the Spirit? How do you see this at work in your life day to day?

The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead is living inside of you if you have joined God's family. What are you wanting to see Him do in your life today?

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WEDNESDAY (11/4/20)

Read Romans 8:12-17

- Therefore... What is the therefore referring to in verse 12-14? Explain these verses in your own words.
- What are the benefits of being a child in God's family?

- Keith spoke a few weeks back about John, in Revelation, being exiled because of his speaking the word of God and his testimony of faith.
- Paul speaks in this passage about us sharing in Christ's suffering.
- 1 Peter 2 commends those who suffer for doing good as people who are following the example of Christ.
- When have you suffered and considered your suffering to be sharing the suffering of Christ?

THURSDAY (11/5/20)

Read Romans 8:18-27

?	What is your present suffering? What is hard for you right now?

- Read Romans 8:28-39
- What is declared true of us in verses 28-30?

What do you think it means that God is "for us?"

How do you feel today? Are you more than a conqueror? Something else?

- When have you felt separated from God's love?
- ? How can you use the truth here to speak to the feelings of being separated?
