Group Discussion Guide for Week of 10/31/2022 Riverside Home Group Discussion Guide

Scripture Text to accompany the themes of the Sunday Sermon; Exodus 33 (NIV)

- 33 Then the Lord said to Moses, "Leave this place, you and the people you brought up out of Egypt, and go up to the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, saying, 'I will give it to your descendants.'2 I will send an angel before you and drive out the Canaanites, Amorites, Hittites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. ³ Go up to the land flowing with milk and honey. But I will not go with you, because you are a stiff-necked people and I might destroy you on the way."
- ⁴When the people heard these distressing words, they began to mourn and no one put on any ornaments. ⁵ For the Lord had said to Moses, "Tell the Israelites, 'You are a stiff-necked people. If I were to go with you even for a moment, I might destroy you. Now take off your ornaments and I will decide what to do with you." ⁶ So the Israelites stripped off their ornaments at Mount Horeb.
- ⁷ Now Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, calling it the "tent of meeting." Anyone inquiring of the Lord would go to the tent of meeting outside the camp. 8 And whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people rose and stood at the entrances to their tents, watching Moses until he entered the tent. 9 As Moses went into the tent, the pillar of cloud would come down and stay at the entrance, while the Lord spoke with Moses. ¹⁰ Whenever the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance to the tent, they all stood and worshiped, each at the entrance to their tent. 11 The Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Then Moses would return to the camp, but his young aide Joshua son of Nun did not leave the tent.
- ¹² Moses said to the Lord, "You have been telling me, 'Lead these people,' but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. You have said, 'I know you by name and you have found favor with me.' 13 If you are pleased with me, teach me your ways so I may know you and continue to find favor with you. Remember that this nation is your people."
- ¹⁴ The Lord replied, "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."
- ¹⁵Then Moses said to him, "If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here. ¹⁶How will anyone know that you are pleased with me and with your people unless you go with us? What else will distinguish me and your people from all the other people on the face of the earth?"
- ¹⁷And the Lord said to Moses, "I will do the very thing you have asked, because I am pleased with you and I know you by name."
- ¹⁸ Then Moses said, "Now show me your glory."
- ¹⁹And the Lord said, "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the Lord, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion. 20 But," he said, "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live."
- ²¹ Then the Lord said, "There is a place near me where you may stand on a rock. ²² When my glory passes by, I will put you in a cleft in the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by. ²³ Then I will remove my hand and you will see my back; but my face must not be seen."

General Question Bank

Observation (what does the text say?) Interpretation (what does it mean?) Application (what does it mean to me/us?) Know (what does the text say about God?) Be (what does it say about us?) Do (what does it call us to do?) Together (What is our communal identity/response according to the passage/Holy Spirit?)

<u>**Discussion/Topic Starter**</u> (Ice Breaker)

Have you ever successfully advocated on someone else's behalf? If so, share the story.

Exodus 33

- O: What things in the text strike you or jump out at you? Why?
 - ***Another way to ask: "Choose one verse or phrase from the passage that stands out to you. This could be something you're intriqued by, something that makes you uncomfortable, something that puzzles you, something that resonates with you, or just something you want to examine further." Now share it with the group
- O: What information is repeated in vs. 3 and 5? Given the flow of Exodus, why is this such a devastating problem? See Exodus 3:12; 19:4; 25:8 for further insight.
- O: What is repeated three times in Exodus 33:7? How does this add to the tension introduced in the previous verses?
- O: Look at the development of Moses' requests (vv. 13, 15, 18). How do they increase in spiritual wisdom and depth, and reveal Moses' deepest desire? How does the Lord respond to Moses' requests (v. 17)?
- In light of Exodus 24:15–17 and 29:43–46, why might Moses be asking to see God's glory in v. 18? l:
- l: In God's answer to Moses (vv. 19-23), what do you learn about his nature and character? What are some ways the Lord has demonstrated these qualities in Exodus?

- I: In response to Moses' request, God says that he will make all his goodness pass before Moses and proclaim his name, "The LORD" (33:19). Given the tension introduced in 33:1–6, what is the significance of God proclaiming his name here?
- A: Moses could not see God's face. What is our privilege and responsibility in light of John 14:8-14 and Hebrews 1:1-4?
- A: In what ways do you demonstrate a desire to know God and to see his glory? How has God honored your requests? Ask God to give you a friend you can share your spiritual aspirations with. Thank him for giving you a desire to love and obey him.

-How WILL you respond this week? What one question do you want us to ask of you next week in regard to this?

Recommended Follow-up:

<u>Pray:</u> Pray together, and really focus in on that we are meeting with God, He's in the room, and He wants us to KNOW Him. Pray together, spend some time being silent.

Respond: Spend this week responding to God's word as fleshed out in the group time, as well as journey through this week's devotional guide.

An explanation on how Riverside structures these discussion guides*:

Riverside defines a disciple of Jesus as a <u>"Know, Be, Do"</u> person. And since Jesus told us to "make disciples" we use the "Know, Be, Do" framework in our discussion guides. We believe the process for this transformation happens in community, hence the **"Together"** part of the Riverside mission as well.

Riverside leadership regularly asks questions around these areas:

- "What do we need to **know** about God?"
- "Who do we need to **be**?"
- "What do we need to **do**?"
- "Together, what is our communal identity/response according to the passage/Holy Spirit?

Here is what we mean by "Know, Be, Do" (based on Colossians 1:9-10, see below)

Know – "to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives..., growing in the knowledge of God." Not just knowing about Jesus, but knowing Him personally, intimately, and deeply. This is also about knowing the scriptures, knowing the voice of the Holy Spirit, even knowing yourself.

Be – "so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way." Becoming more like Jesus (sanctification). This is about our character and our heart and our motivations, our passions and convictions change the more we get to Know Jesus (and others).

Do – "bearing fruit in every good work, …" Knowing Jesus and Becoming like Jesus practically will change our actions. As we grow in these areas we will naturally DO the things that Jesus did while in the flesh on earth (living and loving like Jesus). Some broad categories around DO are evangelism and justice and service.

Notice "bearing fruit in every good work" then yields more "growing in the knowledge of God." In other words, while "Know, Be, Do" are three distinct words, they are deeply interconnected.

As a side note, the next chapter states: § So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, 7 rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness. § See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the elemental spiritual forces of this world rather than on Christ. (Col. 2:6-8) To aid in this process Riverside also has a daily devotional guide available each week.

Colossians 1:9-10, NIV

For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God,...

As discussed in Riverside's HGLT (Home Group Leader Training), these guides are to be starting points for home group leaders to develop their own guides and approaches to leading group discussions. This is a resource tool, not a rigid "go through this guide word-for-word." There are intentionally too many questions for a single home group time.
